Originally designed for melting ice from roads we are finding an abundance of applications for the road drying unit. Currently we have conducted trials on the following:

- Drying out profiled bases after having the profilers use more water (seeing excellent results from an HSE perspective allowing the profilers to use more water to mitigate dust)
- Drying water from roads before sealing and asphalt laying
- Drying out saturated base works
- Speeding up breaking of two coat emulsion seals
- Drying out of wet spray seal aggregates
- Increasing pavement temperatures to MRWA specifications.

We will of course keep everyone informed of the results as the trials progress.
